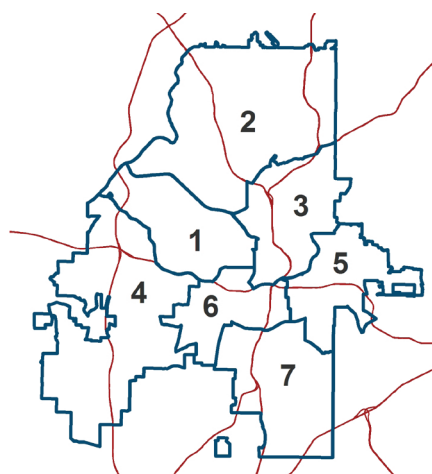
**Outreach District 7 Southside:** (NPU's X, Y, Z)

## **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)**

### **The Connect Atlanta Plan**

A Comprehensive Transportation Plan for Atlanta



#### ***What is the Connect Atlanta Plan?***

The Connect Atlanta Plan is a yearlong study to develop the first citywide transportation plan for the City of Atlanta. The Connect Atlanta Plan will guide the next 25 years of transportation policy and investment in ways that advance Atlanta's larger vision of creating a more modern, vibrant, and sustainable city.

#### ***How will the Connect Atlanta Plan study transportation?***

In developing the plan, the planning team will examine land use, urban design, and economic development issues in addition to carrying out an in-depth analysis of Atlanta's transportation system. Work tasks will be spread over six technical phases and, to be successful, the Connect Atlanta Plan will require active community and stakeholder engagement at each step of the way. Needs will be identified by the public and advisory groups and will guide the project team's research and technical analysis. As ideas develop through this process, they will be evaluated, built upon, and elevated into recommendations.

#### ***What forms of transportation will be studied?***

All. The Connect Atlanta Plan is a multi-modal study, meaning that walking, bicycling, transit, automobiles, and rail will each be studied with equal importance.

#### ***How detailed will the Study's recommendations be?***

The Connect Atlanta Plan is designed to address transportation issues, small and large, in Atlanta. Early public work sessions will address broad issues, such as crafting a bold vision and creating sound goals for the future of transportation in Atlanta. Later workshops, which will be held in the community, will focus on finding solutions to specific, local area issues.

#### ***What challenges does this study face?***

Atlanta is the central city in one of the largest and fastest growing regions in the country. The key challenge for this study is developing a balanced transportation network that expands choice of movement in Atlanta, fuels growth, and creates a more livable City.

#### ***When will the Connect Atlanta Plan be completed?***

The plan will be completed by December 2008. However, the plan's recommendations will live on through Atlanta's Strategic Action Plan and regional transportation plans.
